Message from the Vice-Chancellor



Dear Aspiring Students,

I take this opportunity of welcoming you all to the University of Delhi, a premier Institute for higher education in India.

It gives me immense pride and pleasure to share with you that our university, established and incorporated in 1922 through an Act of the then Central Legislative Assembly, will complete its hundred glorious years on 1st May 2022. The University, which comprised three Colleges with 750 students in 1922, has expanded to 90 Colleges, 16 Faculties, and 86 Academic Departments spread over 407 acres across Delhi, with a student strength of more than 6.7 lakhs, reflecting a microcosm of the diversity in India.

The University is a premier university in the country as per the national and international rankings. The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) for the year 2021 places the University at 12th rank among universities. As per the Centre for World University Rankings (CWUR), the National Rank of the University of Delhi is 6th for 2021-22. The Times Higher Education Asia University Ranking of the University is 201-250 (released in June 2021). QS World University Ranking of the University is 501-510 (2022), QS India Ranking (2021) of the University is 6th among Indian educational institutions and universities, and the QS Asia University Ranking (2022) is 77.

The University has always been a pioneer in laying academic milestones for others to follow. It is actively engaged in bringing a paradigm shift in higher education by orienting curriculum frameworks and structure of the programs with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The NEP 2020 aims to transform the education system in the country and the University is leaving no stone unturned to implement the policy in its true spirit.

It is a pleasure to share with you that the University has decided to implement NEP 2020 from the academic year 2022-23. Implementation of NEP in the University, where more than 500 courses are run for about seven lakh students a mammoth task. However, the University has taken the bold step of implementing a new Undergraduate Curriculum Framework 2022 (UGCF), which will require overhauling the existing system to make the curriculum in line with the philosophy of NEP. The UGCF 2022 is formulated with a student-centric approach and provides flexibility in terms of choice of disciplines of study, developing academic pathways having creative combinations of disciplines for study with Multiple-Entry and Exit points, determining semester-wise academic load and the ease to learn at his/her pace, to the extent possible.

Our students come from as many as 75 world nations, with numbers increasing year after year. The UGCF 2022 shall promote internationalization as the undergraduate curriculum aligns with the international standards and shall promote students' mobility.

Lakhs of students all over India dream to be part of this University after completing their schooling. Enabling equal access for enrolment on a level playing field is the first step toward

making education accessible and inclusive. A significant step towards this is the adoption of the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) as the mode for admission of students in various undergraduate programs of the University from the academic year 2022-23.

The University is expanding its academic horizon and adequate infrastructure development is planned accordingly. After demerger of Delhi College of Engineering and Netaji Subhas Institute of Technology from the University, the vacuum so created is now going to be filled by the introduction of three Bachelor of Technology Programmes, namely B. Tech in Computer science and Engineering, B. Tech. in Electrical Engineering and B. Tech. in Electronics and Communication Engineering under the Faculty of Technology. Accordingly, a new building for the Faculty of Technology is planned to be set upright in the heart of North Campus. Infrastructural expansions are underway, including two blocks for Office and Laboratory in Maurice Nagar and two new hostels in Dhakka Complex. For the convenience of students residing in various parts of Delhi, Facilitation Centres are being set up in Najafgarh (West Delhi), Bhawana (North-West Delhi), SurajmalVihar (East Delhi), and Fatehpur Beri (South Delhi) to deal with various administrative matters.

During the recent pandemic, the University remained functional, without compromising with the health of its students and employees. The admissions, teaching, learning well as Examination continued in online mode . While the situation is returning to normalcy, the University plans to roll out its year long Centenary celebrations with which it intends to leave an indelible mark not only on the academia, but on the larger community as well.

I urge everyone joining the University of Delhi family to come forward and play an active role in the Centenary Celebrations and take forward the rich legacy handed down to us through the hard work and sweat of our predecessors. It is indeed our collective responsibility to give our best in all spheres of our engagement, without compromising with mediocracy, so that we continue to excel not just today but for times to come.

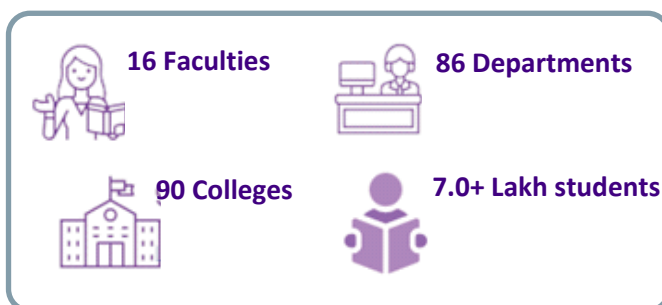

University of Delhi

The University of Delhi is a premier university of the country with a venerable legacy and international acclaim for the highest academic standards, diverse educational programs, distinguished faculty, illustrious alumni, varied co-curricular activities and modern infrastructure. Over the many years of its existence, the University has sustained the highest global standards and best practices in higher education. Its long-term commitment to nation-building and unflinching adherence to universal human values are reflected in its motto: '*NishthaDhriti Satyam*' 'निष्ठा धृति सत्यम्' (Dedication, Steadfastness and Truth).

Established in 1922 as a unitary, teaching and residential University by the Act of the then Central Legislative Assembly, a strong commitment to excellence in teaching, research and social outreach has made the University a role model and trendsetter for other universities.



The President of India is the Visitor, the Vice-President is the Chancellor and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of India is the Pro-Chancellor of the University. Beginning with three colleges and 750 students, it has grown into one of the largest universities in India with 16 faculties, 86 academic departments, ninety one colleges and over seven lakh students. Over 500 programs offered by the University are approved by Academic and Executive Councils, of which close to 200 programs are being considered for NAAC accreditation purposes. The rest being run in colleges are separately accredited.

Today, the university boasts of as many as 15 big libraries apart from libraries in colleges. The University Science Instrumentation Centre (USIC), situated close to the Physics and Chemistry Departments, houses several sophisticated and high-end research instruments. These instruments are used quite frequently by Teachers and Research Scholars of postgraduate departments of the university and many other institutions in Delhi and its neighbourhood. The University has recently laid a fiber-optic network in the North and the South Campuses, connecting all colleges and departments.



2022 – The Centenary Year of the University of Delhi

On the 1st of May in the year 1922, the University was founded with three colleges, namely St. Stephens College, Ramjas College and Hindu College and comprised 750 students. 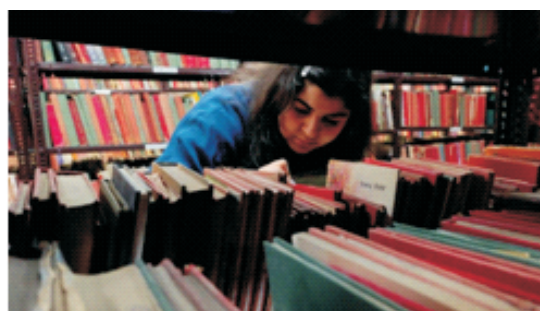

Study at University of Delhi

Registration to Undergraduate Programs of University of Delhi

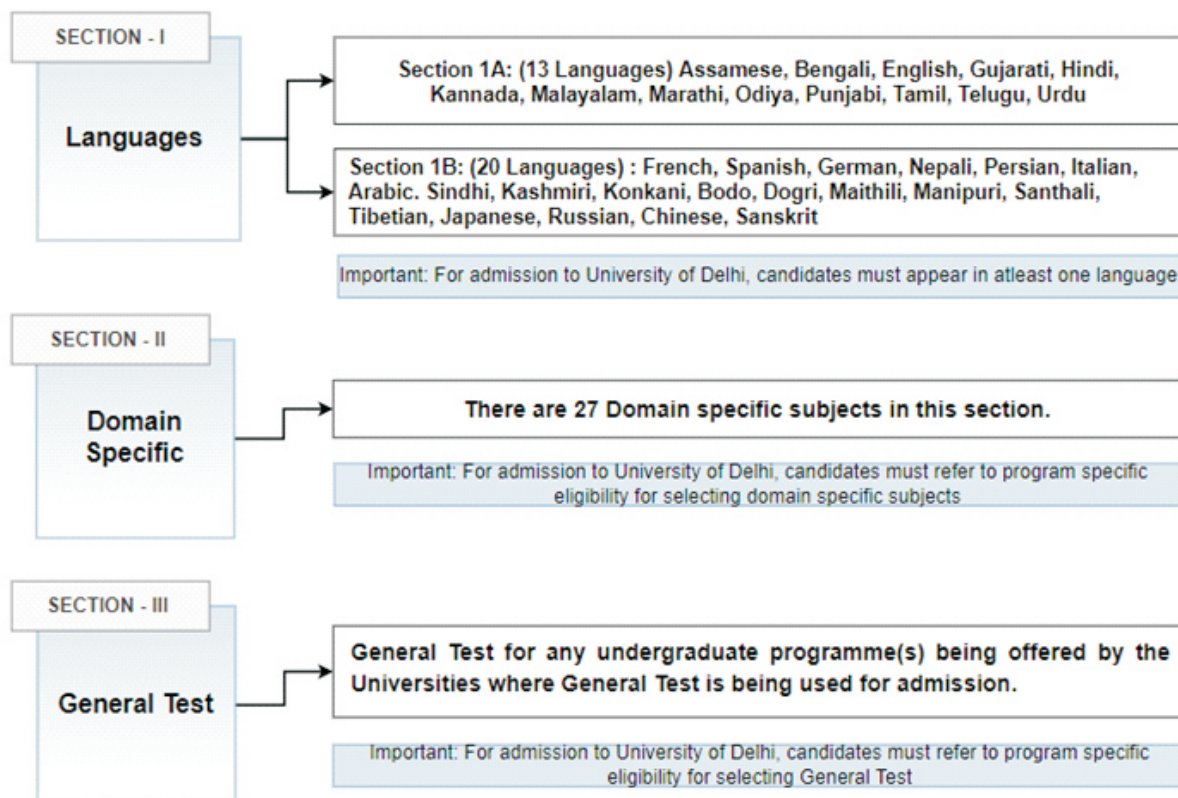
For admission to Undergraduate programs of the University of Delhi, candidates must register for CUET- 2022 at <https://cuet.samarth.ac.in/>.

Candidates desirous of seeking admission to the School of Open Learning (SOL) to register at sol.du.ac.in. Candidates desirous of seeking admission in Non-Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB) must register at <http://admission.uod.ac.in> (Registration process to be announced on the website of the University)

Admission Process

Admissions to all programs will be done through a Centralized e-counselling procedure. To minimize the number of rounds of counselling, and to start the academic session timely, the University may explore the possibilities of admitting candidates over and above the sanctioned strength in the initial rounds of counselling. Further details related to admission processes such as e-counselling, Tie Breaking rules, etc. will be notified separately.

Structure of Common University Entrance Test (CUET) -2022



- Candidates must carefully study the Program-Specific Eligibilities of Undergraduate programs of the University of Delhi before registering for CUET 2022 at <https://cuet.samarth.ac.in/>
- For admission to the University of Delhi, the candidates must appear in CUET in the subjects/Test papers mentioned in the Program-Specific Eligibilities for which s(he) is desirous to take admission. Grievance related to non-appearance in CUET 2022 or the required subjects/test papers will not be entertained.
- For all updates related to CUET, the candidates must visit the National Testing Agency (NTA) website: <https://nta.ac.in/>

Important Points

1. Admissions to all Undergraduate Programs at the University of Delhi will be based on the scores obtained in CUET 2022 (except for admissions to the School of Open Learning (SOL), Non-Collegiate Women Education Board NCWEB, and Foreign Nationals).
2. An eligible candidate desirous of seeking admission to the Undergraduate Program(s) of the University of Delhi for the academic session 2022-23 must read the contents of this Bulletin of Information, as well as the notifications, updates and information published on the admission website of the University very carefully.
3. Candidate must appear in CUET in only those subjects in which s(he) has passed Class XII.
4. In case the subject studied at Class XII is not mentioned in the CUET, the candidate must appear in the subject that is similar/closely related to the subject s(he) has studied at Class XII (for example, if a candidate has studied Biochemistry in Class XII, s(he) must appear in Biology in CUET 2022).
5. Merit will be based only on the 'combination of subjects in which a candidate has appeared in CUET' as mentioned in the respective Program-Specific Eligibility.
6. The candidate must have studied and passed Class XII Examination or its equivalent from a single recognized board.
7. Only the scores obtained in CUET 2022 will be considered for admissions to the academic year 2022-23.
8. Candidates must study the Program-Specific requirements carefully and then appear in Subjects/papers of the CUET 2022.
9. The Candidates are advised to check that they satisfy all eligibility criteria for the program(s) for which they are applying in the entrance test. Admission is subject to the Candidate's fulfilling the eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned program of study. In case a Candidate does not meet any eligibility criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned program and appears in the entrance test, it is at the Candidate's own risk and cost. If at any stage, it is found that eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission, if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto.
10. Before registering for CUET 2022, the candidates are advised to carefully read the Bulletin of Information and consult the Delhi University Act, 1922 and the Statutes. The Ordinances, Rules and Regulations of the University of Delhi, available on the University website, would be binding on them.
11. As per ordinance-I of University, there is no minimum age bar for admission to the undergraduate programs in the University and its colleges except in the programs where the respective regulatory bodies, such as Medical Council of India (MCI), All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), Bar Council of India (BCI), National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), Dental Council of India (DCI), etc. have prescribed the minimum age requirement in their regulations.
12. Gap year will not be a bar for purpose of admission to undergraduate programs. However, such candidates must also appear in CUET-2022 for admissions in academic year-2022.

Candidates desirous of taking admission to School of Open Learning (SOL) must register at www.sol.du.ac.in.

Candidates desirous of taking admission to Non-Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB) must register at University of Delhi admission website at <http://admission.uod.ac.in> (registration process to begin from May 01, 2022)

Eligibility Requirements for Undergraduate Admissions

Common Minimum Eligibility*

The candidate must have passed the Class XII or its equivalent examination from a single recognized board.

* In case a candidate has passed subjects/s from more than one board, s(he) can appear for CUET 2022 in the subjects in which she) has passed Class XII; however, for the purpose of ascertaining the Minimum Eligibility, the marksheet/ degree of only one board will be considered (For example, If a candidate has appeared in CBSE Board Examination with five subjects except for Mathematics and later appears and passes Mathematics from another board such as the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), the minimum eligibility shall be ascertained from his/her mark sheet issued by CBSE only).

The marks obtained by the candidate in CUET 2022 will be considered for computing the total marks according to the Program-Specific combinations of subjects for deciding merit and granting admissions in the undergraduate programs. Merit will be based only on the 'combination of subjects in which a candidate has appeared in CUET 2022' as mentioned in the respective Program-Specific Eligibility.

General Guidelines

The applicant must be citizen of India.

The applicant should have passed the Class XII examination of any Board/ University examination in India or any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).

Applicants with gap year(s) will not be at any disadvantage for admission to undergraduate courses.

Physics is an experimental and theoretical science that systematically studies the laws of nature operating at length scales from the sub-atomic domains to the entire universe. The core areas of study within the disciplinary/subject area of the B.Sc. (Hons.) Physics program are: Classical and Quantum Mechanics, Electricity and Magnetism, Thermal and Statistical Physics, Wave theory and Optics, Physics of the Materials, Digital Electronics, and specialized methods of Mathematical Physics and their applications in different branches of the subject. Along with the theoretical course work, students also learn physics laboratory methods for different branches of physics, specialized measurement techniques, analysis of observational data, including error estimation, and scientific report writing. B.A. (Hons.) - Hindustani Music: Vocal/Instrumental (Sitar/Sarod/Guitar/Violin/Santoor)

This program is designed to develop an understanding of the origin, development and historical background of Hindustani Music in the form of Vocal and Instrumental forms. This course helps to understand and compare different aspects of the prescribed ragas and demonstrate practically the scales, ragas and compositions therein. In addition, it aims to provide the learners an ability to perform and present ragas on stage, gain knowledge and understand the positive aspect of music in personality development.

The main focus of the course is to establish a better understanding of the Percussion Music-Tabla/Pakhawaj, knowledge about Prachalit Talas, learn the notation system of Hindustani Music, musical instruments of South East Asia, Central Asia & Europe. The course is more practically inclined along with relevant theory for achieving better understanding. It helps the students acquire theoretical and practical skills and ideas about the chronological development of Tabla/Pakhawaj and their Playing techniques, thus giving them a holistic approach to Percussion Music-Tabla/Pakhawaj.

RESERVATION POLICIES

Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) Candidates

22.5% of the total numbers of seats is reserved for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).

The Candidate must be in possession of the Caste/Tribe certificate in his/her own name at the time of Registration and Admission. The Caste certificate should clearly state:

- (a) Name of his/her caste/tribe
- (b) Whether candidate belongs to SC or ST
- (c) District and the State or Union Territory of Candidate's usual place of residence, and
- (d) the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his / her caste / tribe is approved as SC or ST.

Candidate will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate at the time of admission.

The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC / ST certificate:

- a. District Magistrate / Additional District Magistrate / Collector / Deputy Commissioner / Addl. Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate / Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- b. Chief Presidency Magistrate / Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate / Presidency Magistrate.
- c. Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- d. Sub- Divisional Officer of the area where the Candidate and/ or his family normally resides.
- e. Administrator / Secretary to the Administrator/ Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Candidates to note that the SC / ST Certificate **from any other person / authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the Candidate happens to belong to SC or ST, Candidate's caste / tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule.**

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all seats reserved for Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe Candidates.

Colleges shall not refuse admission to any SC / ST Candidate on the basis of medium of instruction. Any deficiency in the knowledge of any particular language should be addressed; for this purpose remedial classes may be arranged by the College by utilizing grants available from University Grants Commission.

Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (OBC, Non-Creamy Layer, Central List)

27% seats are reserved for the Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC - Non-Creamy Layer, Central List).

At the time of giving admission to an OBC Candidate, the College will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central (Govt. of India) List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes (available at the website http://ncbc.nic.in/backward_classes/index.html).

The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the Candidate (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93- Estt. (SCT) dated 15.11.1993).

The OBC Candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and **whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only**, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the Candidates as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res- I) dated 31 March 2016). The validity of the non-creamy layer certificate shall be for the **financial year 2021-2022, issued on or after 31st March, 2022.**

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all the seats reserved for OBCCandidates.

Reservation policy for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019/ 63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments / Centres / Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission of candidates belonging to EWS category.

Reservation of Seats for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

A. Locomotor Disability

Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

1. **"leprosy cured person"** means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—
 - i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifestation of deformity;
 - ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
 - iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;
2. **"cerebral palsy"** means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or morespecific areas of the brain, usually occurring before,

during or shortly after birth;

3. "**dwarfism**" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;
4. "**muscular dystrophy**" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;
5. "**acid attack victims**" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual impairment

6. "**blindness**" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction
 - i) total absence of sight; or
 - ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
 - iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
7. "**low-vision**" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:
 - i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
 - ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree upto 10 degree.

C. Hearing Impairment

8. "**deaf**" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
9. "**hard of hearing**" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
10. "**speech and language disability**" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

D. Intellectual Disability

A condition characterised by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

11. "**specific learning disabilities**" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
12. "**autism spectrum disorder**" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

E. Mental Behaviour

"**Mental illness**" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterised by subnormality of intelligence.

F. Disability caused due to Chronic neurological conditions, such as—

13. "**multiple sclerosis**" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
14. "**Parkinson's disease**" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

F. Blood Disorder

- 15. "**haemophilia**" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;
- 16. "**Thalassemia**" means a group of inherited disorders characterised by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.
- 17. "**Sickle cell disease**" means a haemolytic disorder characterised by chronic anaemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "haemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.

F. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities)

Multiple disabilities including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government.

Concessional/Waiver of fees in respect of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

- a. Candidates with physical disabilities pursuing various programs of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centres, and Institutions / Colleges of the University shall be **exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees**, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students' Union and Identity Card fee(As per amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University).
- b. PwBD Candidates who meet the merit for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD Candidate.
- c. As per the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels / Halls of the University are **exempted from payment of all hostel fees and charges** except refundable caution fee and the mess fees. Persons with Physical Disabilities who are students shall pay 50% of the Mess fee and the remaining **50% of their Mess Fee** will be met by the University of Delhi. **Similar norms are to be adopted by the Colleges in respect of PwBD Students residing in various hostels of the Colleges.**
- d. PwBD students who are getting fellowships / financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fees / charges / mess fees subject to the following conditions.

Reservation for Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW)

Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for Candidates under this category, program-wise in all colleges.

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the CW quota of the University must appear in CUET 2022.

All such Candidates have to upload the Educational Concession certificate issued by **any of the following authorities** on the proper letterhead:

- (a) Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi.
- (b) Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board.
- (c) Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
- (d) 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate.
- (e) Ministry of Home Affairs (For Police Personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards)

No other format shall be permissible. Proofs of the CW category in the form of ID card of parent or dependent, Medical card, Ration card, CSD card, etc. are not admissible in lieu of certificate in correct format. The priority must be clearly mentioned in the certificate. Certificates that do not mention the relevant priority will not be considered.

Admission may be offered to the Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (**Priority to IX**) including Para-Military Personnel (**only Priority I to V**), in the following order of preference:

Priority I	Widows/Wards of Defence personnel killed in action;
Priority II	Wards of Defence Personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service with disability attributable to military service;
Priority III	Widows/Wards of Defence Personnel who died while in service with death attributable to military service;
Priority IV	Wards of Defence Personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service;

Reservation of Kashmiri Migrants (KM)

Up to 5% seats are reserved program-wise in all colleges for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants. All the wards of Kashmiri Migrants will have to upload a certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by Divisional Commissioner/ Relief Commissioner.

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Kashmiri Migrants quota must appear in CUET 2022.

Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students must appear in CUET 2022.

Nomination of Seats for Sikkimese Students

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Sikkim nomination scheme must appear in CUET 2022.

Sikkimese students nominated by the Govt. of Sikkim shall be considered for admission by the University in Colleges where hostel facilities are available (AC Resolutions 51 dated 05/06/1980 and 122 dated 17/12/1990). The allocation of Sikkimese students for admission as well as for hostel accommodation in respective colleges be made by the Vice-Chancellor at his discretion.

Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi must appear in CUET 2022.

Admission to the wards of University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9 a & b dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments thereof.

Candidates must be in possession of a valid Employment Certificate issued by due officials at the time of registration. Only the Employment certificate uploaded at the time of registration will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.

Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) and Sports Quota

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary quota for ECA and/or Sports must appear in CUET 2022.

For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances.
Further details shall be notified separately.

Admission to Minority Colleges

Candidates desirous of taking admission under Minority quota must appear in CUET 2022.

In Minority Colleges 50% of the seats are for candidates belonging to Unreserved category and 50% are reserved for Minority candidates.

For admissions to St. Stephen's College and Jesus & Mary college, following admission criteria shall apply:

Candidates applying for the Sikh minority colleges need to submit a certificate from the Delhi Sikh Gurudwara Management Committee (DSGMC) certifying their minority status, at the time of registration and admission.

Candidates applying for the Christian minority Colleges need to submit their baptism certificate and/or Church membership certificate as per the requirements of the respective Colleges.
