INFRASTRUCTURAL DEVELOPMENT

Since its establishment in 2014, the college has witnessed extensive infrastructural growth, transforming it into a modern, well-equipped academic institution. Over the past decade, major facilities have been developed including 30 classrooms, 6 tutorial rooms, 4 laboratories, a two-storey library, seminar and multipurpose halls, a research centre, and dedicated spaces for NCC, NSS, and the Students' Council. The old office block was completely revamped to include conference rooms, a medical room, and a placement cell. Sustainability has been a key focus, with rainwater harvesting systems and rooftop solar panels meeting the college's power needs. Most of the infrastructure is accessible to persons with disabilities.

A major leap in development came with the construction of a new seven-storey building, initiated in 2018 and nearing completion after pandemic-related delays. With 35 classrooms, 5 lecture theatres, 20 tutorial rooms, a four-storey library, 10 laboratories, and ample space for departments and societies, the new block significantly enhances academic and co-curricular facilities. The new sports ground is already in active use and has contributed to numerous student achievements in inter-university competitions, underlining the impact of holistic infrastructural development.

Now in its 11th year, Aryabhata College continues to build on a strong foundation of academic distinction and all-round development. An industrial visit to Honda Cars India Ltd. offered insights into manufacturing and automation practices. Each event witnessed strong participation and faculty support, reflecting *Sankalp's* commitment to bridging academic knowledge with practical, real-world exposure.

DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS

Teacher In-charge: Dr. Naveen Kumar Jain

The Department of Mathematics demonstrated academic excellence throughout the year through significant initiatives. It organized a one-week interdisciplinary Faculty Development Programme (FDP) in collaboration with Ramanujan College and Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas, focusing on the contemporary relevance of Vedic knowledge in science and education. The

event featured esteemed scholars discussing Vedic mathematics, ancient number systems, and the integration of traditional wisdom with modern pedagogy. Additionally, the department hosted *Sigma Fest 2025*, a student-centered event that included a seminar by Dr. Rohit Bajaj on overseas opportunities and the importance of learning foreign languages. The fest also featured a series of engaging games promoting intellectual and strategic skills, and an interactive session with alumnus Mr. Ajay Kumar, who shared career insights and personal experiences. These initiatives enriched both faculty and student development, blending academic rigor with career guidance to foster a holistic learning environment.

DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

The Department of Psychology organized a series of enriching events during the academic session 2024–25, focusing on key areas such as mental health, psychology, and professional development. In May-July, the FDP was conducted from July 1 to 7, with over 40 participants and 8 esteemed experts delivering more than 12 engaging lectures on Ancient Indian Mathematics. This programme was highly successful and well-received, reflecting the Centre's thorough preparation and the valuable contributions of the experts. Additionally, the team worked on finalizing the course content and improving resources for the upcoming academic sessions. The year 2024 marked a milestone in both course development and educator training, advancing the Centre's mission effectively.

The Add-on Courses Committee

The Add-on Courses Committee successfully completed a 30-hour course on Clinical Skills and Therapy Practices during September-October 2024. This course, which included practical training, was conducted in collaboration with Mind Gardens, a Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME), Government of India registered entity. The Economics department, in collaboration with the Addon Committee, organized a 40-hour workshop on "Statistics and Data Analysis with R" for students of Economics and Business Economics. The workshop, supervised by Prof. Deepika, was attended by 60 students. Currently, the Committee is running a 100-hour Beginner's Level Japanese Language Course in partnership with Nippon Academy, with 6 students actively participating. Looking ahead, the active members of the Committee are exploring the feasibility of launching courses in Personality Development and Spanish Language Proficiency.

This year marked a vibrant journey of creativity, learning, and performance as we celebrated 10 glorious years of Rangmanch in October 2024 with our amazing alumni. We explored cinematic storytelling through our short film PYAALI, which delicately portrayed emotional themes. Expanding beyond traditional theatre, we collaborated on various advertisement projects, offering members valuable professional exposure. Currently, we are developing MANN KE BHANWAR, a stage production that promises depth and introspection. To further strengthen our craft, we are also organizing two workshops, focusing on stage and street theatre. With every endeavor, Rangmanch reaffirms its dedication to artistic excellence and continues to be a dynamic space for expression, collaboration, and theatrical innovation.

ZeroHour: The Bilingual Debating**Convenor: Mr. Sachin Chauhan**

In the academic year 2024–25, ZeroHour successfully conducted a range of intra-college and inter-college events that enriched the debating culture of Aryabhata College. Finance & Investment Cell**Convenor: Ms. Tripti**

The Finance and Investment Cell (FIC) has had an outstanding academic year. The flagship festival, Euphony, saw over 5800 registrations across seven competitions and earned a spot among the Top 10 Collegiate Festivals in India at the Unstop Talent Awards 2025. FIC's social outreach initiative, Samarath, spread financial literacy to underprivileged communities. Additionally, FIC launched Austerity, the first student-led research journal at the University of Delhi, and released

the fourth edition of its Annual Magazine, *The Absolute Advantage*. The fifth edition of Finomena, the cell's speaker's conclave, was a huge success, with over 650 registrations and insightful sessions from esteemed speakers such as ICAI President CA. Charanjot Singh Nanda and Major General Yash Mor (Retd.). The Finance Premier League 2024 offered a hands-on learning experience, and the second season of the *Bucks and Banter* podcast simplified financial concepts through engaging discussions.

Enactus – Aryabhata College

The Enactus Society has made significant progress in its environmental and social initiatives. Project Aarazi successfully developed organic pesticides, which have been positively tested and are now ready for production. The project also plans to establish a composting unit on campus, supporting waste management and soil restoration efforts. Project Ibtida, aimed at combating air pollution, introduced carbon-negative products made from hemp, including Anagha, a line of eco-friendly hemp bags. Hemp, a sustainable crop, absorbs more carbon dioxide than it emits and requires minimal water, making it ideal for promoting environmental sustainability. Project Palaash has run successful seasonal campaigns, expanding its product offerings with AROMY, incense cones made from repurposed floral waste. Other campaigns such as Abir, which sold organic gulal for Holi, Bandhan, which offered eco-friendly rakhis for Raksha Bandhan, and Utsav, which produced attar-infused soy wax candles for Diwali, all focused on sustainable, natural products.

Nibs & Brushes- Fine arts and creative writing Society

The 2024–25 session of Nibs & Brushes was a vibrant blend of creativity, collaboration, and cultural engagement. Kicking off with an interactive orientation and a detailed recruitment process, the society welcomed new talent with engaging icebreaker sessions and a cultural trip to Red Fort that inspired artistic outputs. Collaborating with the Rotaract Club of Delhi Pegasus, the team painted murals on water sanitation, promoting awareness through art. A seminar on global education trends and the flagship fest, Riwayat 2.0, showcased the society's creative range with workshops, exhibitions, competitions, and performances. Their final event, "Qala Chittha," concluded the year with a spirited art and writing contest during Aavahan'25. Throughout the year, the society won accolades, including first place at Monetica, Hindu College. The Heritage Society***Convenor: Ms. Namita***

The Heritage Society, in collaboration with SPICMACAY and Tathagat (the History Society), organized a series of events in 2024–25 aimed at preserving and celebrating India’s rich cultural and historical legacy. The Onam celebration on 23rd September featured traditional performances, games, and Kerala cuisine, offering students an immersive experience of the festival’s cultural roots. On 9th October, the Navratri celebration, "Subh Vijay," brought together over 150 participants for a spirited evening of Garba dancing, traditional attire, and festive treats, fostering unity and cultural pride. The highlight of the academic year was a one-day educational excursion on 22nd February to Mehrauli Archaeological Park. Led by faculty, students explored historical monuments like Balban’s Tomb and Jamali-Kamali Mosque, gaining insights into Mughal and colonial-era architecture. Collectively, these events successfully promoted cultural awareness, encouraged community participation, and enhanced students’ understanding of India’s artistic and historical traditions.

Gender Sensitization Committee***Convenor: Dr. Roshni***

The Gender Sensitization Committee began the academic year with an orientation workshop in collaboration with the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), aiming to sensitize students about the ICC's structure, redressal mechanisms, and the GSC's ongoing initiatives. Students were also informed about volunteer induction for the year. The Committee organized a film screening and group discussion to initiate dialogue on gender roles and restrictive societal stereotypes. A session on *Menstruation and Academic Life* was held to promote awareness about the challenges menstruating students face and emphasized inclusive understanding among male peers. A POSH awareness workshop was conducted for teaching and non-teaching staff and students, educating them on legal protections against sexual harassment. In collaboration with *Mind Over Matter*, the Economics Society, the GSC hosted a talk on unpaid labour and gender roles. During the College Fest, students actively engaged in promoting gender sensitivity through creative verbal and visual campaigns organized by the Committee.

Gandhi study Circle***Convenor: Prof. Satish K Jha***

In the academic year 2024–25, the Gandhi Study Circle at Aryabhata College organized impactful events focused on the relevance of Mahatma Gandhi's philosophy in contemporary times. On 2nd October 2024, a seminar titled "*Understanding and Applying Gandhi Today*" was held, alongside a speech competition on "*Gandhi's Vision of Non-Violence: A Path to Global Peace and Harmony*". The event saw enthusiastic participation from 120 students, with insightful speeches that explored the concept of non-violence as a powerful force akin to love. Esteemed guests judged the competition, and winners from Hindu and Ramjas Colleges were recognized. On 30th January 2025, the Circle observed Gandhi's Martyrdom Day with a lecture titled "*Remembering Gandhi*", in collaboration with IQAC. Delivered by Prof. Gurpreet Mahajan, the lecture delved into Gandhi's enduring legacy and its relevance in modern struggles for justice, equality, and peace. Both events successfully fostered dialogue and reflection on Gandhian principles.

The Placement Cell***Convenor: Dr. Girish Garg***

Placement Cell demonstrated remarkable progress this academic year, facilitating recruitment from over 260 companies, reflecting a 20% increase from the previous session. We conducted five structured training sessions on resume building, interview preparation, and LinkedIn optimization,

open to students from both Aryabhata College and other institutions. The Cell hosted three offline Pre-Placement Talks by 1Lattice, Infonative Solutions, and R1 RCM, alongside numerous online sessions. Our flagship event, *AGNITO 5.0*—the annual placement and internship fair—witnessed 1400+ registrations and offered 85+ career opportunities through a two-day hybrid format. The offline phase featured 30 company stalls and HRs from 25+ organizations. Furthermore, the Cell organized four on-campus seminars and a series of webinars on topics such as B-School admissions, international vs domestic MBA, and careers in emerging sectors, significantly enhancing student preparedness and awareness.

Sahāyana - Peer Support Initiative

Convenors – Dr. Thangbiakching and Dr. Anisha Juneja

Sahanya offers students a safe and empathetic space to discuss challenges such as college adjustment, academic stress, relationship concerns, homesickness, time management, self-confidence. In 2024–25, peer supporters launched an orientation program titled “*Discussion on Transition and Adjustment Issues in College Life*” to introduce themselves to first-year students and raise awareness of emotional and psychological challenges during the transition to college. Faculty coordinators conducted four training sessions for the supporters on key areas such as case history taking, active listening, addressing anxieties, and maintaining ethical boundaries. So far, five students have received peer support, with sessions supervised by faculty. Recognizing the need for professional mental health resources, a list of free or low-cost counselling services was compiled. Additionally, ‘Listening Circles’ were incorporated into Mental Health Awareness Week 2024 and are now being developed as a regular feature of Sahāyana’s peer support efforts.

Aryabhata Incubation Centre

Aryabhata Incubation Centre (AIC) during the year emerged as a vibrant hub of student innovation and entrepreneurship. The Centre incubated five promising startups across various development stages: *Edicut* (edible cutlery), *Floramed* (herbal wellness), *Ipothesis* (research consulting), *Menstrebles* (menstrual care), and *Campus2Hire* (recruitment platform). It also launched *Edu-Hub*, a free digital platform offering academic resources, with its revenue supporting scholarships and entrepreneurial ventures. AIC's flagship business strategy competition, *StratX*, attracted over 1,000 participants and featured real-world problem-solving, judged by alumni and industry experts. The Centre also hosted *The Campus Catalyst* and *E-Summit'25*, spotlighting innovative startups such as Desi Rituals, Peachin', Harbomed, and Beyond Beta Research. These

initiatives provided experiential learning and showcased AIC's commitment to fostering practical business solutions and social impact. With strong faculty mentorship and dynamic student leadership, AIC successfully nurtured creativity, collaboration, and enterprise throughout the year.


