NCC: AT A GLANCE

The NCC in India was formed by the National Cadet Corps Act of 1948. It can be traced back to the “University Corps” which was created under the Indian Defence Act 1917, with the objective to make up for the shortage in the Army. In 1920, when the Indian Territorial Act was passed, the “University Corps” was replaced by the University Training Corps (UTC). The aim was to raise the status of the UTC and to make it more attractive to the youth. The UTC Officers and cadets dressed like the army. It was a significant step towards the Indianization of armed forces. In 1948, the Girls Division was raised in order to give equal opportunities to school and college going girls.

The NCC was given an inter-service image in 1950 when the Air Wing was added, followed by the Naval Wing in 1952. In the same year, the NCC curriculum was extended to include community development/social service activities as a part of the NCC syllabus. National Cadet Corps (NCC) is a youth organization under the Ministry of Defence which ensured multifaceted development of youth with a sense of duty, commitment, dedication, discipline and moral values.

The aims of the NCC laid out in 1988 have stood the test of time and continue to meet the requirements expected of it in the current socio-economic scenario of the country. The NCC aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens. Further, it aims at creating a pool of organized, trained and motivated youth with leadership qualities in all walks of life, who will serve the Nation regardless of which career they choose. Needless to say, the NCC also provides an environment conducive to motivating young Indians to join the armed forces. The need for having motto for the Corps was discussed in the 11th Central Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting held on 11 Aug 1978. The mottos suggested were Duty and Discipline; Duty, Unity and Discipline; Duty and Unity; and lastly Unity and Discipline. The Final decision for selection of “Unity and Discipline” as motto for the NCC was taken in the 12th CAC meeting held on 12 Oct, 1980.

NCC ACTIVITIES

The National Cadet Corps is the only organization of its kind, which imparts Leadership, Discipline, Integration, Adventure, Military, Physical and Community Development training to over 13 lakhs youth of the country through various activities and camps.

NCC CAMPS

Various NCC Camps are held such as Combined Annual Training Camp (CATC), Basic Leadership Camp (BLC) Pre-Republic Day Camp (PRDC), Advanced Leadership Camp (ALC), Course at Himalayan mountaineering institute Darjeeling, Para Troopers Camp (PTC), National Integration Camp (NIC), Army Attachment, Republic Day Camp (RDC), Hiking and Trekking Camp, Thal Sainik Camp (TSC)

CERTIFICATES

Senior Division and Senior Wing: Cadets recruited from colleges fall under Senior Division and are under the command of Associate NCC Officer (ANO)

C-Certificate is the highest recognition of training and qualification of a Senior NCC cadet.

B-Certificate is the initial recognition of training and qualification of a Senior NCC cadet.

NCC at Aryabhata College

Aryabhata College is the youngest college of Delhi University. In a short period of 6 years it has achieved prominence as one of the fastest growing and promising results. It provides a very healthy academic and cultural environment to its young adults for their all-round developments. Aryabhata College however finds itself at disadvantage as far as NCC allotment is concerned. Aryabhata College was formerly known as Ram Lal Anand College (Evening) and therefore shared its NCC wing with Ram Lal Anand college. Aryabhata College was established as an independent college in 2015. From the very beginning Aryabhata College has shown its commitment towards providing all the opportunity to its students to ensure their growth with a serious sense of social responsibility. NCC is an organization that is committed towards equipping young adults with basic military training as an alternative response team in case of crises. Aryabhata College recognized the importance and value of association with such an organization. Therefore, the college has been tirelessly trying to get an NCC Division allotment. Aryabhata College applied for NCC allotment of seats in 2017 with 7 Delhi BN NCC, located at b/6 Safdarjung Enclave. Application with details of the strength of college was sent to the Army Wing in May 2017. In August 2017 the college applied once again at 7 Delhi BN NCC, NCC Bhawan, Badli Road, Sector 19, Rohini. Another application requesting NCC allotment was filed at 2Delhi Naval NCC, Defence Sailing Club, Dhobi Ghat Road, Delhi in 2019. In the year 2021 in January once again the college followed up with the Army wing. (link)

Despite the long and patient wait, Aryabhata College is determined to get itself formally attached to the NCC division on its campus. However, the College encourages and permits its students to join NCC in other neighboring colleges of the university. Limited association with NCC proves restricting but not discouraging.
