



The Northeast Society along with the Nibs and brushes, dance and music society were encouraged to participate in the same. The Northeast Society contributed two cultural dances consisted of a Bihu, the most popular folk dance from the state of Assam. The dance is performed by young men and women during Rongali Bihu to express their joy on the arrival of the spring where the dancers sway their bodies gracefully to the rhythm of folk music. The second dance Cheraw also known as Bamboo dance from the state of Mizoram. The Cheraw performers usually dance in groups of six to eight, though the numbers can vary. Two bamboo staves are placed horizontally on the ground. The male performers, who are in pairs, hold two bamboo staves and clap them against each other and on the floor rhythmically. Meanwhile, the female performers dance and weave in between the bamboos to the rhythm.





**5.** A **Frehsers Program and Orientation-** "*Aikatmya*" was held on 31th January 2023 between 3pm 5pm in Activity room, Aryabhatta college. Our Principal Prof. Manoj Sinha, chief mentor graced the event and addressed the freshers with a heart-warming speech and shared some anecdotes. 




